Burning Hours: 1 hour after sunrise to 2 hours before sunset.

FIRE DEPARTMENT STIPULATIONS:

- 1) Water available under pressure in hose with nozzle.
- 2) Constant supervision of burn until completely extinguished.
- 3) All burn piles must be a minimum of 50 feet from any structure.
- 4) Only vegetation is allowed to be burned. All other materials are prohibited.
- 5) Cease burning if wind exceeds 10 mph, when smoke is a nuisance or a safety hazard, or when ordered by the fire dept.
- 6) Call fire department prior to starting the burn and again upon completion (at the above numbers).
- 7) No flammable or ignitable liquids to be used to aid in the ignition.
- 8) A copy of this permit must be on-site when burning.

The undersigned permittee hereby consents to observe all applicable State or County rules and regulations and to comply with all of the additional requirements set forth herein. In addition, the undersigned permittee hereby acknowledges that the Mohave County Board of Supervisors, the City of Bullhead City, and the Bullhead City Fire Department will not be considered responsible for any property damage, personal injury, or inconvenience incurred directly or indirectly as a result of the issuance and execution of this open burn permit. Penalties for violating this permit will be in accordance with the Arizona Revised Statutes.

The issuance by the fire chief, or his designee, of an open burn permit does not release the permittee from any of the requirements of any other jurisdictional agency, or from the requirements of any applicable and legally constituted agreements.

THIS PERMIT IS VALID ONLY FOR THE DAY, TIME, AND CONDITIONS PRESCRIBED.

Allowable burn materials may include:

Brush, grass, crop, weeds, untreated wood or lumber.

Prohibited Materials:

ALL PLASTIC MATERIALS such as bottles for household chemicals, grocery and retail bags.

TOXIC VEGETATIVE MATERIALS such as oleander, poison oak, poison ivy, and poison sumac.

WASTE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS such as waste crankcase oil, transmission oil, used oil, and oil filters.

CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL such as chemically treated wood, lead-painted wood, linoleum flooring, composite counter tops, asphalt shingles, tar paper, electrical wire insulation, asbestos, and thermal insulation.

HAZARDOUS WASTE PRODUCTS such as paints, pesticides, cleaners and solvents, stains and varnishes, flammable liquids, plastic pesticide bags and containers.

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL CONTAINERS that contained lead compounds, cadmium compounds, mercury and arsenic compounds.

PLASTIC AND RUBBER PRODUCTS including bottles for household cleaning, plastic grocery and retail bags.

AUTOMOTIVE WASTE such as tires and anti freeze.

POLYESTER PRODUCTS

AEROSOL SPRAY CANS

BATTERIES, FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

EXPLOSIVES OR AMMUNITION

NON PAPER FOOD GARBAGE

Emission Reduction Techniques:

- a. Minimize the material to be burned;
- b. Prevent fire from spreading by lining the area where open burn is conducted and application of fire retardant foam, or water;
- c. Allow the material to dry before burning;
- d. Minimize soil content in slash piles and by constructing piles under dry soil conditions or by using hand piling methods;
- e. Burn in piles;
- f. Use a back fire (burn in the opposite direction of wind) when grass is burned;
- g. Extinguish the smoldering burns;
- h. Burn before litter falls;
- i. Burn prior to precipitation.
